#### S-23-13S

Petitioner: Aaron Albracht & Nathan Pevey

Chris Kalashian presented the staff report.

AERA has requested a short variance from the applicable requirements of District Rules 2070, 2201, 2520, and 4623, in addition to applicable conditions of the subject permits. The requested short variance period would be effective for a non-consecutive 144-hour period to occur sometime between May 11, 2023, and July 11, 2023, inclusive. If granted, the variance would allow AERA to continue to store VOC containing liquids in the subject tanks without a functional or operating VRS while the pipe section is replaced.

Chris Kalashian noted two areas where the Staff Report was amended: the variance start date was changed from May 11, 2023 to May 17, 2023, and on Page 3, Finding 5, the second sentence was removed.

Petitioner, Aaron Albracht, thanked Chris Kalashian for adjusting Finding 5 and confirmed that the District Staff Report was accurate.

# S-23-14S

Petitioner: Matthew Jalali

Shannon Moore presented the staff report.

ALON has requested a short variance from the applicable requirements of District Rules 2070, 2201, 2520, and 4623 in addition to the applicable conditions of the subject permits. The requested variance period would be for 21 consecutive days to occur sometime between June 1, 2023 and July 31, 2023, inclusive. If granted, the short variance would allow for the continued storage of VOC containing liquids at the Wastewater Treatment Unit without a functional or operating VRS while they replace a 250 foot section of header piping.

Shannon Moore noted one correction to the Staff Report on Page 3, Item 2, under "Recommendations". The second listed Permit Number was corrected to S-33-20-23.

Dr. Na asked for an economic loss calculation. Shannon Moore clarified that ALON would be subject to District enforcement action and penalties if this variance is not approved, so the total economic loss would be determined by the size of the leak and the type of violation.

Petitioner, Matthew Jalali, added that if ALON is not approved to perform this maintenance, the startup of the refinery will be delayed and the facility would have to shut down in order to perform the same maintenance in the future, leading to increased economic losses.
